


Current Land Use



Current Land Use


- In September 2015, attained support from the Task Force and the Central & Western District Council on extending the land use of the observation wheel site for one year.

Long-term Development




Public Response

Proposed Temporary Use



- Continue using the portion of the site within Site 7 for operating an observation wheel with ancillary facilities.
- To let out the reduced site through open tender for three years from mid-2017 to mid-2020.
