






#### **The Refined Urban Design Framework**

•The public generally **supported** the refined urban design framework including the proposed design themes of the five character precincts.



The Refined Urban Design Framework

#### **Attractions and Activities**

- •In general, the provision of more easily accessible public open space with flexible design/uses for different users of different age groups was welcomed.
- •The public concurred that the proposed waterfront uses/ activities can bring **diversity** and add **vibrancy** to the harbourfront areas.



East Coast Park Precinct

#### **Cycling Activities**

- •Some commenters especially the cyclists and cycling organizations raised **concern on the need to dismount bicycles** along some sections of the proposed cycle trail and they considered it an undesirable design. They considered the long "off-bike" portions of the cycle trail might result in issues of **management difficulties** and negative impacts on the responses/behaviour of the cyclists, etc.
- •At the same time, some public members including elderly and non-cyclists persons raised concerns on the interface between the cyclists and pedestrians, and public safety issues.



#### **Celebration Precinct**

- •The public generally **agreed** to the HEPs in Celebration Precinct to strengthen the ceremonial significance and identity of the Golden Bauhinia Square and the promenade nearby by developing three new plazas with distinctive themes.
- •The precinct should be designed with **high flexibility** to cater for multi-purpose public events (e.g. festival events and weekend markets) other than the official celebration events.
- •Some public members suggested that **art** and **cultural elements** should be encouraged and incorporated **all along the waterftront**. The displayed art elements should blend in well with the waterfront context.



#### **Pierside Precinct**

- •The public generally supported developing the Pierside Precinct into a vibrant waterfront park with diversified activities and attractions .
- •Some public members raised specific comments on the commercial/retail activities for the Gourmet Dining Square
  - **Smaller scale** F&B outlets
  - Small shops that reflected local Hong Kong heritage
- •Some also proposed the **provision of pet facilities** in this Precinct with reference to the pet garden provided at East Coast Park Precinct.



Pierside Precinct

#### **Water Sports & Recreation Precinct**

- •Most public members agreed that the proposed uses of the water space should be beneficial to the general public at large
- •There were also comments that sufficient **supporting facilities** such as parking and loading/unloading facilities changing rooms, toilets, F&B, etc. should be provided to support the water sports and recreational activities.
- •Some of the public members showed concerns on the issues of wave attenuation and water quality, which may deter water sports and recreation activities.

#### **Revitalized Typhoon Shelter Precinct**

- •The public supported to the design intention of re-discovering the old typhoon shelter's historical heritage and local character by re-introducing the floating restaurant(s), water taxi, etc.
- •Regarding the mode of the floating restaurant, some public members preferred **smaller scale eateries** in a designated area within the typhoon shelter while some suggested **a row of sizeable floating restaurants** along the water edge of the typhoon shelter.
- •The public also supported the proposed cantilevered deck of the Northern Breakwater but some were concerned about public safety and crowd control.
- •Exploring the possibility of extending the proposed boardwalk to the western edge of typhoon shelter was suggested by the public.



#### **East Coast Park Precinct**

- •The public in general **agreed** with the design intention to develop the newly reclaimed land at the waterfront of North Point into a **vibrant and easily accessible community park**.
- •Public aspirations about the design of the community park included more interactive water edges, more pedestrian friendly street design, user-friendly signage with art element and careful management of the proposed community garden.
- •Beautification/streetscape improvements in the adjacent areas of the East Coast Park Precinct must be implemented together with the overall harbourfront enhancements in order to revamp the area in one cohesive design, particularly the streetscape at Oil Street and Watson Road.

## **Major Comments: (2) Connectivity**

#### Connectivity


•The public generally supported the HEPs to strengthen the **north-south connections** between the waterfront and the inner city, as well as **east-west connections** along the waterfront. They pointed out that **barrier-free access** should be incorporated in the design of the connections.

•Noting the physical site constraints in providing land area for car parking facilities, many public members agreed that the public should be encouraged to access the waterfront via public transport.

•Most public members supported the proposed covered walkway to provide a weather-proof access to the New Wan Chai

Ferry Pier.

## **Major Comments: (3) Other Comments**

#### **Protection of the Harbour Ordinance (PHO) Implications**

 Views received generally supported the proposed cantilevered boardwalk along Victoria Park Road for enhancing the pedestrian environment even though the proposals might have implications for the Protection of Harbour Ordinance.

#### **Waterfront/Open Space Design**

- Design of waterfront and open space should allow for shared use by different users of different age groups, including the disabled
- Overall design should be flexible, avoid "over-designed" spaces and excessive obstacles (e.g. railings).

#### **Implementation and Management**

 Some public members asked about the implementation agent and implementation timetable. They were looking forward to timely implementation of the HEPs so the public could enjoy and get closer to the waterfront at the soonest.

#### **Blue-Green Infrastructure**

- Some shading/ trees with larger canopies near the water edge should be provided for a more pleasant environment for pedestrians and users.
- The public suggested the introduction of more marine supporting facilities (i.e. landing steps, bollards, and shading facilities).

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## Responses to Key Public Comments and Possible Refinements of HEPs

The team takes into consideration comments and suggestions from PE2, and make refinements to the HEPs focusing on the following five <u>major aspects:</u>

- 1. Cycle Track and Cantilevered Boardwalk
- 2. Provision of Pet Playground in Wan Chai District
- 3. Shading and Planting
- 4. Marine Support Facilities
- 5. Wave Attenuation

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## **Way Forward**

- To consolidate public comments and compile the PE2 Report
- To refine the HEPs in responses to public comments
- To carry out detailed technical assessments on air ventilation, landscape and visual, traffic, sustainability, business viability, etc.
- To develop the basis of the Planning and Design Briefs
- To work out the implementation plan, including implementation timetable, phasing, and quick-win projects
- To work with Members during the process, and to organize a working group meeting separately to seek members' views on the above tasks
