## Proposed Short-term Use at the Three Berths Released from Western District Public Cargo Working Area

## Task Force Meeting（23 Jan 2018）

Two proposals，both recommended letting out about $2000 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ ，through open tender，to a non－profit making organsation（NPO）／social enterprise （SE）for running a leisure farm \＆ ancillary facilities
$2000 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ for leisure farm and ancillary facilities


## Task Force Meeting (23 Jan 2018)

Major difference is about the management of the public open space portion of the Site (i.e. the remaining $5500 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ ).

## Proposal I

To be managed by the same NPO / SE of the leisure farm.

Proposal 2
To be managed by the Government.

## Members' views

- Mixed views on the management of the $5500 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$
- Some preferred NGO / SE as this would allow greater flexibility in the usage of the open space
- Some doubted whether there are NPOs/SEs which were financially and technically capable of managing the public open space on a day-to-day basis
- Supplementary information sought
- Public consultation conducted
- Basic facilities to be provided by the Government under Proposal I

- Some concern groups have since expressed their views through various channels to DEVB. We have been following the developments closely.

## Consultation with Stakeholders - Highlight

Views that the concern groups expressed have been fairly consistent -

- The Site is not suitable for running a leisure farm
- The Site is not"idle" \& railings not needed
- Public consultation
- Outsourced management not required - should be managed by Government with more innovative practices

They want the Site to be opened for public use as it is.


## Consultation with Stakeholders - Highlight

- Given its large area, there is scope for accommodating other uses at the Site in addition to leisure farm.
- Therefore, we put forward clear proposal to the Task Force and C\&WDC in their Jan meetings -
- 20\% of the Site for leisure farm
- $80 \%$ for open space for public enjoyment in the manner they desire


## Management of Public Open Space

The outstanding issue is -

Should the selected NPOISE or LCSD
take over the management of the public open space?


## Management of Public Open Space

- Since last meeting, we have consulted several charitable bodies/welfare NPOs on the two proposals.
- Most supported letting out vacant government land along the harbourfront for community purposes.
- Indicated that there was strong demand for community farm activities and some NPOs \& SE have the operation expertise.



## Management of Public Open Space

- Respondents were reluctant to manage and maintain the large-sized open space, because -
- potential financial burden and liability issue
- limited commercial activities on the Site, unlikely to generate enough revenue to cover the management and maintenance expenditure
- managing the public open space on a round-the-clock basis would be too much a responsibility for NPO/SE


## Management of Public Open Space

- If the Site was managed by the LCSD, the NPOs envisage that they would be able to collaborate with the department and organise events such as play days for young kids and bazaars thereon as appropriate.



## Management of Public Open Space The Proposal

Taking into account the views collected through the informal sounding-out exercise, we propose to proceed with Proposal 2.

Letting out about $2000 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ of the Site to a NPO/SE for operating a leisure farm and ancillary facilities

Having LCSD to run $5500 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ as public open space in the established manner.

## Management of Public Open Space The Proposal

- Phased minor works at the $5500 \mathrm{~m}^{2}$ open space to improve public safety \& amenities.
- Works include railings along the waterfront, lighting \& benches, resurfacing with paving blocks, and where appropriate grass cover, etc.



## Management of Public Open Space

- Proposal 2 is most practicable -
- Mixed use can accommodate aspirations of different users.
- Bring in non-governmental sector in managing harbourfront sites through the leisure farm.



## Management of Public Open Space

- LCSD-managed public open space with enhanced facilities can enable public enjoyment in a safe and pleasing manner.
- The proposal can be implemented fairly quickly, meeting the aspirations that the Site should be opened up for public use as soon as possible.



## Next Step

- Subject to Task Force's views, we will invite bids for the leisure farm as soon as possible after reporting the latest developments to the C\&WDC.
- Aim to award the STT in 2018 Q3, completed the minor works and opened the site for public enjoyment in phases starting from 2018 Q4.
